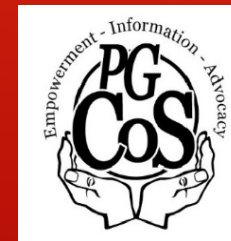

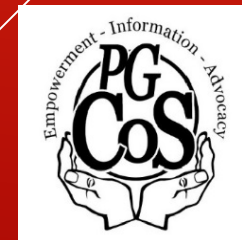

 - ▶ Human resource sharing



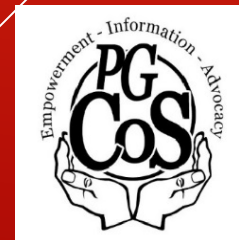

BC Ministry of Health to give \$15 million to United Way of the Lower Mainland to expand non-medical home support programs

February 14, 2012

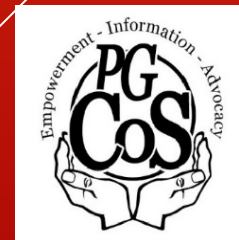
Today the Ministry of Health announced a \$15 million grant to United Way of the Lower Mainland to expand the non-medical home support programs that have been piloted under the name Community Action for Seniors Independence (CASI). This was part of a larger announcement of government's action plan to address seniors' issues. The action plan will support healthy aging to improve the quality of life for BC seniors to help them remain independent for as long as possible. United Way will use the funding to expand the availability of non-medical home support services in up to 65 communities across the province over the next three years.

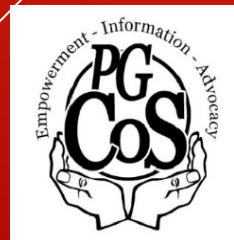
